- The way that people act or control themselves.
- *Remember, behaviour is a neutral term.*
- *It refers to everything people do.*

- “Olden days” - obedience
- “Nowadays” - cooperation

Misbehaviour – Definition

- Behaviour that is inappropriate for the setting or situation in which it occurs.
- Many don't like the subjectivity of the term, "misbehaviour". They prefer "**inappropriate**", or "**disruptive**".



Classroom Instruction and Classroom Management – An inevitable link?

- Teachers once considered that teaching and discipline are two separate undertakings
- i.e. – teaching is about imparting knowledge, and when misbehaviors were going to inevitably happen, they were ready and allowed to impose harsh measures.
- This is not the case anymore – **discipline is an integral part of teaching**



MISBEHAVIOUR IN EDUCATION

1. Interferes with learning
2. Threatens or intimidates
3. Oversteps society's standards of moral, ethical, or legal behaviour

- Research-based “**Behaviour Guidance**” strategies for early child care staff and educators
- Top tips: Most important is to “develop a respectful, caring (and trusting) relationship with every child, right from the start”
- “Get to know each child and what may be affecting her behaviour. Observe children carefully and pay attention to the environment where specific behaviours are happening”
- When uncomfortable with child’s behaviour, difficult to respond appropriately and effectively
- When educators feel like they are losing control; recognize this discomfort; and discuss it with supportive team members
