“Institutional and psychological closeness”

More than a year has passed since the world first faced the social change caused by the coronavirus pandemic. Millions of people have spent long months in an institutional and psychological environment. There remains a real threat of recurrence of such problems. In the works of M.Yu. Kondratyev's topic of closeness is studied on the examples of various communities deprived from the wider society. The regularities of intragroup structuring and interpersonal relations in closed small groups were revealed. The conditions for the emergence and development of conflicts in such communities are analyzed. In the modern world, psychological closeness has influenced the system of relations not only in small, but also in medium and large social groups. Almost all of humanity has turned into a system of closed communities, which has given rise to problems of relationships, personal development and socialization. Socio-psychological research M.Yu. Kondratyev is a significant scientific base that allows us to deepen our understanding of the patterns of closeness caused by the coronavirus pandemic, to build programs for the prevention and correction of its negative consequences.

The current closeness is both a source of problems of the future (in particular, the consequences of a training system devoid of direct communications), and an impetus for the development of productive forms of business interaction in the virtual space. It clearly has not only negative, but also positive, from a psychological point of view, aspects. Or those that are still difficult to assess unambiguously.

- *What is the danger of psychological closeness? Does it have positive aspects?*
- *What is the difference between the current closeness in a pandemic from other types of psychological closeness?*
- *Total social deprivation as a challenge to the psychological stability of mankind*
- *The impact of the psychological closeness of the group in the context of a pandemic and social isolation on mental health and personality development*
