Dear Colleagues!

We invite you to participate in the online conference **«Cochenov Readings 2022. Psychology and law in modern Russia»**, conducted by the Moscow State University of Psychology and Education with the participation of the «V. Serbsky National Medical Research Centre for Psychiatry and Narcology» of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation on **November 9-11, 2022**.

The conference will be held in a mixed format. In case of complicated epidemiological situation the format can be changed to online.

The conference is devoted to relevant issues of legal psychology in Russia and abroad. Its purpose is to bring together specialists working in various fields of legal psychology, to discuss and generalize the experience of their theoretical and practical developments, to determine the prospects for the development of this branch of psychological science.

The thematic sections of the conference are determined by the problems as traditional areas of legal psychology (legal, criminal, forensic, and penitentiary psychology), as well as new intensively developing areas, such as the legal psychology of children and adolescents. Theoretical and applied aspects of mental disorders in the context of legal psychology will be considered. Special attention is planned to be paid to issues of professional training and advanced training of specialists in the field of legal psychology.

The name of the conference, “Cochenov Readings” indicates its memorial character. The scientific event is dedicated to the memory of the outstanding scientist M.M.Cochenov (1935 – 1999), who made a great contribution to the development of Russian legal psychology.

2 Psychology of Criminal Behavior

Psychology of certain types of offenses. Psychological problems of organized crime. Psychology of terrorism. Problems of criminal aggression. Psychology of the victim and its role in the development of crime. Psychological trauma in crime victims. Psychological rehabilitation of victims of crime. Domestic violence.

3 Legal Psychology of Childhood

Developmental psychology in a legal context: theory and practice. Internet environment: opportunities and risks. The development of legal awareness in children and adolescents. Prevention of violence and abuse of children. Deviant and illegal behavior of children and adolescents and its prevention. Psychological technologies in forensic and investigative practice with participation of juvenile defendants, victims, witnesses. Psychological aspects of juvenile justice. Forensic psychological assessment and comprehensive forensic psychology-psychiatric assessment of juveniles. Psychological correction and rehabilitation of juvenile offenders. Psychological assistance to children and adolescents affected by crime.

4 Legal Psychology and the Risks of a Digital Society

The transformation of traditional forms of socialization of children and adolescents under the influence of a digital society. Psychological aspects of personal information security. Family and marriage in the information society. Deviant behaviors implemented in the digital space and methods for their prevention. Negative effects and prevention of cyber bullying. The risks of cyber socialization and the use of the Internet by children. Psychology of crimes committed using computer and network technologies. Psychological aspects of crime prevention and combating crime in cyberspace. The psychology of cyber terrorism. Prevention of Internet addiction. Psychological aspects of using information technology in crime prevention and deviant behavior. Opportunities and prospects of using psychological profiling in social networks. Psychological methods of protection from the negative information impact of criminal subculture and destructive communities on the Internet.

5. Practices of prevention of social risks of childhood: evidence-based approach and assessment of effectiveness

Responsibility to the person and, especially, to the child for the quality of the result of their activity is the basis of professionalism of the teacher, psychologist, all specialists working with children, and the basic conceptual value of legal psychology of children and teenagers. Implementation of projects and programs in the field of prevention of social risks of childhood, which can include difficult life and legally significant situations, violations in the sphere of significant relationships (bullying, social ostracism, conflicts) and many others is a specific area of activity requiring special psychologically competent approaches to their

development, evaluation, promotion and institutionalization. The section assumes discussion of problems, opportunities and experience, including, international, justification of application of practices, methods, technologies of projects or programs and their results, received within the limits of the evidentiary approach by means of scientific methods of research. The section is integrated with the reporting conference on the project "Ecosystem of childhood: Approbation of the system model for preventing social risks in the organizations for orphans and children left without parental care" (partner project of MSPSU and the Federation of Educational Psychologists of Russia, implemented in 2020-22 on grant of the Department of Labor and Social Protection of Moscow).

6 Legal psychology and mental disorders

The role of mental disorders in the genesis of criminal, suicidal and victim behavior. Psychological, psychiatric and sexological studies in criminology. Psychological research in forensic psychiatry, sexology and narcology. Forensic psychological and comprehensive forensic psychological and psychiatric examination in criminal and civil proceedings. Non-procedural forms of using psychological knowledge in investigative activities and in legal proceedings. Prevention of socially dangerous acts of people with mental disorders. Clinical and psychological diagnosis of law enforcement officers. Prevention and rehabilitation of mental disorders and psychological maladjustment of justice workers and security forces.

7 Penitentiary psychology and the practice of the execution of criminal sentences.

The current state of penitentiary psychology as a science. The study of the personality and social environment of prisoners. Scientific foundations and practice of psycho-correctional work with prisoners. Mediation and conciliation procedures in prisons. Psychological support of staff of the penal correction system. Regulatory support and criteria for evaluating the activities of the psychological service of the penal system. Prospects for the development of psychological services in the penal system.

8 Psychological support for law enforcement

The value and practical use of psychological science data in the activities of internal affairs officers. Psychological support of law enforcement in countering extremism and terrorism, in working with law enforcement staff, in training staff for law enforcement. Psychological and management problems of law enforcement. Professional culture and ethics of employees of internal affairs officers. Psychology of professional selection and professional orientation of employees of internal affairs officers. Directions for the prevention of professional deformation in the legal system. Image of a police officer. Problems of improving the regulatory legal support of psychological work in the police department and other security forces. The socio-psychological climate in the unit and the moral and psychological state of the police officers. Psychology of high risk professions. Psychological assistance to victims in extreme situations.

9 Main Directions for the Development of Mediation in Russia

Mediation and restorative practices, of which restorative mediation is one type, are spreading to new areas in Russia. The values of dialogue, restoration of people's subjectivity and peaceful resolution of conflicts and difficult situations are in demand in schools, in families, in the resolution of entrepreneurial disputes, in the choice of response to offenses, including crimes, and in the construction of forms of work to prevent social risks. This expansion is echoed in the development of a number of bills. The development of practice leads to its differentiation and complication, while the normative support requires generalization and unification. The section is devoted to the application of mediation and restorative practices in different spheres of human relations and institutions and to a discussion of the fundamental differences in the models used.

10 Round table "Modern Trends in Legal Psychology Training".

How is the training in the field of legal psychology carried out? What are the needs of society in specialists in legal psychology? What are the programs of multilevel training in the conditions of changing standards of education? The specifics of professional standards and features of professional actions related to prevention, support and rehabilitation of people in difficult and legally significant situations. What is the

organization of practice in the training of legal psychologists? This is by no means a full range of topics that will be touched upon at the round table.

- **Master class “Possibilities of folklore game in the prevention of deviant behavior”**

One of the main reasons for deviant behavior is the lack of an environment in the city in which children and adolescents could socialize, gain the ability to communicate and coexist with peers and adults. Traditionally, it was the environment of the folk game. This master class proposes to use folk games for the prevention of deviant behavior, taking into account their availability, a wide range of effect, the possibility of participation of different ages at the same time, minimal material costs. Within the framework of the master class, there would be a demonstration of a presentation on the topic and a teenage game program with the participants of the master class and second-year students of the faculty of Legal psychology of Moscow State University of Psychology and Education. Similar programs were successfully carried out with the participation of students in special schools, boarding schools, and educational colonies for juveniles. At the master class, everyone can take a chance and visit different age periods.

- **Workshop "Re-socialization of Women Released from Prisons".**

The innovative model of comprehensive work on preparation for release and support of women released from prison will be presented here, developed during the project "Together we can do it! Co-implementers of the project are Altai Regional Public Organization "Rubicon", Ministry of Social Protection of Altai Region, Regional Crisis Center for Women, and Department of Federal Penitentiary Service of Russia for Altai Region. This pilot project is aimed at forming mechanisms to include restorative technologies in the process of preparing women for release, which begins in prisons, in preparatory work of social centers staff with families (including underage children) of women prisoners and holding general family meetings using different programs (family conference, restorative mediation, circles). The purpose of this innovation is resocialization of prisoners, restoration of family ties and prevention of illegal behavior of women and their minor children by means of restorative technologies and, at the same time, improvement of professional level of specialists of social institutions of the region. Participants of the project will also share their new work experience on the example of specific cases.

Requirements for Abstracts

Page settings: A4 format, margins of 2 cm on all sides, Word 98 and higher editor, 14-point Times New Roman font, 1,5 spaced. Alignment of the paragraph in width, indentation of the first line of the paragraph (red line) – 1.25 cm

The volume of abstracts is 4 thousand characters, including spaces.

When registering the name of the work and authorship, you must be guided by the following rules:

- a) The title should be in bolded capitals, centered, without a dot at the end;
- b) On the next line symmetrically in the center – the surname and initials of the authors are indicated (for each author – first the surname), the font is ordinary;
- c) On the next line in the center – the full name of the organization is indicated with the city and country in brackets, the font is ordinary.

After the description of the title and authorship of the work, the main text of the material is located in one line.

The text should not contain tables and figures, subscripts and footnotes.

References to the literature are arranged as follows. In the text, the link is made in parentheses indicating the name of the author of the publication and, separated by a comma the year of publication. For example: (Petrov I.I., 2006). After the main text, the subtitle is indicated through the line: Literature – in bold. The list of references is made out at the end of the abstract according to the rules of the bibliographic description of scientific publications. Authors are arranged alphabetically.

Requirements for the design of poster reports

Mandatory Requirements:

- The poster is made on one sheet of A1 format (594 × 841 mm) in portrait (vertical) orientation;
- The title of the poster is made in direct font size of 70-75 points;
- Surname and initials of the authors are executed under the heading of the poster in font size 40 points;
- The main text of the report is in 24-28 paragraph font;

- Illustrations (drawings) on the poster should be made in a format of at least A5 (15x20 cm);
- Captions under figures and the text inside the diagrams is performed in a font of 20 points;
- All explanations (the organization represented by the authors, contact details, links to grants, etc.) are drawn up as footnotes and are located at the bottom of the poster after the main text (font size: 20 points).

Recommendations:

- The traditional division of the poster text into blocks is welcomed: annotation, goals and objectives of the work, research sample, experimental material, research results, discussion of the results, etc.;
- Authors can prepare printed materials reflecting the main information of the report in A4 format to distribute to all interested participants in the conference;
- It is recommended to carry out the report on a light background, with dark text, using direct sans-serif fonts, applying as a text highlight a change in its saturation, rather than italics or underlining; Drawings and charts are done in color.

Received materials are considered. Materials made in violation of the requirements or not on the subject of the conference are not reviewed and not sent back.

A collection of abstracts will be posted on the website psyjournals.ru and on the conference website by the beginning of the conference.

Presentations of reports and other multimedia materials as an addition to these can be attached *in the registration* form or sent separately to confjp@yandex.ru with the name of the author, topic of the report and conference events, but not less than a month before the conference.
